

HEALTH & SAFETY UPDATES

Our PEC and health and Safety Committee are pleased to share with you the following updates to the Health and Safety plan based on the new protocols recently outlined by the Ministry of Education's announcement on Feb 15th.

Effective immediately:

- Spectators are once again welcomed to all school events, including sports games, masses and assemblies. Students may attend all school events at full capacity such as mass and assemblies. School games or events to which guests and spectators are invited will operate at 50% capacity. There continues to be no proof of vaccination required for any K-12 school events. (Please note: According to the Educational Athletics Committee, spectators will be allowed at 50% capacity after the grade 7 basketball playoffs. Also to note, some of the public venues for events do require vaccination passports.)
- Masks continue to be required indoors unless eating or doing strenuous physical exercise but are
 optional outdoors.
- We continue to ask all parents, guests and visitors wishing to enter the school building (or gym) to check-in at the school office via the main school entrance wearing a mask, where you will be provided with a visitor lanyard.

Although these changes are long-awaited good news, it's important to review our school Communicable Disease Plan. We will continue "to apply a trauma-informed lens to [our] planning." We kindly ask families to continue to perform a daily health check prior to school start. If a child is feeling sick, please stay home until symptoms have cleared and they are ready to return to their learning environment. At drop off and pick up, we also ask you to maintain a safe distance from students during the lineup entry and at the locations where students are being dismissed.



RAPID ANTIGEN AT-HOME TESTS

Rapid antigent at-home tests have arrived! You can pick up your family's kit at the office on Thursday or Friday (when dropping off the re-registration package). One-per-family. Please keep them for testing at home, especially before returning to school after spring break.

Our Spirit Wear inlucdes any additional ESS items purchased through the **UR Store**. This typically includes sweatshirts and sweatpants.



SALMON IN GRADE 4!

The grade 4 salmon hatchery has some exciting news! Over the past week, the grade 4s have been enjoying watching as their salmon eggs hatch and become alevins! An alevin is the life stage between egg and fry. At this stage, the little fish still has an egg yolk attached to their tummies where they get their food from. During this stage, the little fish don't do much other than lay around and try to find hiding places throughout their small habitat. While still a little far away, the grade 4 class is getting very excited for their field trip after spring break where they will be releasing their salmon fry back into nature, in the same river that they were first collected as eggs."

TRAVELLING OUTSIDE CANADA?

The federal government has announced changes to the entry requirements for those that return to Canada after travelling abroad effective February 28th. Of particular interest for schools is the change to the requirement restricting student school attendance for 14 days after their return to Canada:

 Children under 12 years old, travelling with fully vaccinated adults, will continue to be exempt from quarantine, without any prescribed conditions limiting their activities. This means, for example, they no longer need to wait 14 days before attending school, camp or daycare.
