

Morning Drop-Off in the Front of School (on Heather St.)

Our school is nestled in the heart of Vancouver, sharing the road with pedestrians, cars and cyclists. To avoid congestion, there is "Drop Off Zone Only" in front of the school from 7:30am - 9:00am.

If you need to get out of your car or walk your child to school, please park in the courtyard (accessible through the alley behind the gym).

Please follow these guidelines.

Morning Drop-Off in the Courtyard

The courtyard is accessible in the morning <u>until</u> **9am only**. Please drive in very slowly as students are gathering in the courtyard before school starts. **Please follow the this diagram of the courtyard:**

STUDENT DROP-OFF ONLY ZONE

ON HEATHER ST. (FRONT OF SCHOOL)

STEP 01

Pull forward to the Main Entrance

Pull forward or pull into a space that's closest to the front, ensuring there are no gaps between cars. Please do not stop close to the parish/kindergarten entrance as this creates congestion.



STEP 02

Drop-off ONLY - No Parking Anytime

Remain in your vehicle while your children get out. You may help them get their things quickly and return to your seat. A parent volunteer will assist younger students to their door. Please do not park or walk away from your

their door. Please do not par or walk away from your vehicle at any time. There is parking available in the courtyard until 9am.



STEP 03

Drive Away Carefully

Drop-off and drive-away. Please watch for bikers as you pull out and students crossing the crosswalk.




STEP 04
